NEWTOWN, Conn., 17 Oct 2001-- The Partners International Foundation, a tax-exempt organization, Target Technologies, the Xerox authorized sales agent and re-seller in Columbus, Georgia and the National Infantry Association, today announced that Robin Moore will visit Columbus Georgia and conduct a book signing at the Buick Challenge to raise funds for charity. Mr. Moore is the author of over twenty-five published books that include *The Green Berets, The French Connection, Pitchman, The Devil to Pay, Hotel Tomayne, The Country Team, The Khaki Mafia, The Fifth Estate, The Moscow Connection, The Accidental Pope.*

Mr. Moore will conduct the book signing of *The Green Berets* and his new book *Target Cuba* during Military Appreciation Day, 26 October at Calloway Gardens. Targer Technologies is donating space in their sponsorship booth located in the EXPO AREA at the Buick Challenge for the event. Prior to that, Mr. Moore will be visiting students at Hardaway High School in Columbus, Georgia on Thursday 26 October 2001. This is part of Partners International Foundation's continuing commitment to enhance K-12 education.

The fundraising effort is the idea of Katie Morris, age 14, a Freshman at Hardaway High School in Columbus, Georgia. Miss Morris approached Partners International who agreed to sponsor her project that focuses initially on children who lost a parent in the Pentagon attack on September 11<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Moore will donate a portion of all book sales to the fund on behalf of the National Infantryman's Association. Partners International Foundation is working to establish several initiatives following the events of September 11, 2001:

- Collecting funds for children of victims from the attack on the Pentagon and Flight 93.
- Support to volunteer organizations that contribute to search, rescue, and recovery operations, a focus on community-based groups that are often over-looked.
- A long-term capacity to plan, respond, and support that will include planning conferences, seminars, and similar events with government and non-government organizations in order to enhance planning for and rapid response to disasters.

- Developing a capability for immediate disaster response to facilitate inter-agency and inter-organization coordination as well as focus efforts among disaster relief organizations and local, state, and federal agencies. Where support to the victims of and organizations involved in the September 11th events is coordinated after-the-fact, the Foundation plans to establish a reserve of resources available for future disaster response.

Due to the anticipated high demand for Mr. Moore's books, donors can order copies with a personalized inscription at the event if supplies are exhausted. Mr. Moore will autograph a photo with the donor at the time that Target Technologies will provide using Xerox's latest state of the art imaging and printing technology. In addition, Target Technologies will provide a discount coupon toward any color printer purchase to anyone who purchases a book or donates \$10.00 or more to Miss Morris' project with Partners International Foundation and Mr. Moore.

Partners International Foundation has a history of working with Fort Benning and local community groups. The foundation provided computers to a Fort Benning school, and partnered with Muscogee Rotary in projects using donations from local physicians and hospitals as well as the Indian Health Service to support Women and Children's wellness in Grenada. They obtain human rights speakers for international military officers training in the United States, supported local Columbus Boy Scouts, and local ophthalmologist Dr. Steve Beaty's eye clinic in Zimbabwe among others. Participants in a previous program with Fort Benning and Muscogee Rotary received the Vice Presidential Hammer Award for quality improvement. In 1998, as part of another Partners International/Muscogee Rotary Project, Dr. Theogene Rudasingwa, Rwandan Ambassador to the United States, personally visited Columbus to thank the Community for gathering donated medical items for a woman and children's clinic in his country. Partners International is also engaged in programs to gather donated computers for disabled veterans, enhance K-12 education, and other projects supporting women, children, and alleviate suffering.
